DRILL 2 Information, LI

Drill 2 is a REGIONAL event hosted by our Regional Director. The training will take place **15-17 September 2023 and is for both League and Sea Cadets**. Activities will include row boats, ropes course, rifle range; air soft rifle (League Cadets), .22 caliber rifle (Sea Cadets); climbing tower and archery.

TRAINING LOCATION

Our training will be held at the Baiting Hollow Scout Camp (1774 Sound Ave, Calverton, NY 11933) which is owned and operated by the Suffolk County Council of the Boy Scouts of America. Located on the North Shore of Long Island, the camp has a fresh-water lake and access to a beachfront on Long Island Sound. The Camp offers boating, climbing, shooting sports, project adventure (zip lining) Archery, nature studies and more.

LOGISTICS

The training will take place 15-17 September 2023. Three meals will be provided on Saturday, 16 Sept (B, L, D) and two meals will be provided on Sunday, 17 Sept. Cadets will be housed in cabins. Sleeping arrangements will be assigned on the day of arrival.

TRANSPORTATION

Transportation to and from the training site is the responsibility of the parent.

FINANCES / ACTIVITIES

The cost for this training is \$95.00 per person. The training fee includes meals, activities and accommodations.

CODE OF CONDUCT/HAZING/FRATERNIZATION:

As this is an overnight event, all cadets must review the CODE OF CONDUCT. This will be the basis for a quality training experience. There is ZERO TOLERANCE for hazing and/or fraternization. All recruits, cadets and staff must review the “Hazing Orientation” presentation on Homeport.

REPORTING PROCEDURES:

The George Washington Division will report at 1900 on Friday, 15 September 2023 in LI. Dinner is not provided, so cadets should eat something before reporting. Departure will take place on Sunday around 1500

hours or as determined by weather, traffic and activities.

Cadets must bring: signed release form with current emergency contact information, valid USNSCC ID, and a complete Seabag. The specific Seabag list for Drill 2 is below.

If your cadets need to take medications, a Request to Administer Medications (Form NSCTNG025 – included in this packet) must be completed and approved prior to training.

HAIRCUTS

Ensure hair length and style meet USNSCC regulations.

CADET PREPARATION:

To prepare for this evolution, each person should:

- Do physical training. Push-ups, planks, and running are a good way to start. Physical training is included in the cadet-training curriculum.
- Pack his/her seabag or ruck sack. This will help in knowing what has been brought to training. Each cadet will be 100% responsible for his/her own belongings.
- Break-in footwear. Combat boots will be the footwear for this training.

SEABAG:

Review the sea bag list.

ALL CADETS MUST BRING A WATER SYSTEM (canteen with web belt or water bottle is OK). All items must be marked with the cadet's last name and first initial. A sea bag inspection will be conducted on the first day of training.

ADULT STAFF UNIFORM:

Authorized uniforms for adult staff are Type III or Type I NWUS and Alternative Uniform with outdoor-appropriate footwear. No cell phones allowed for any cadets while conducting training.

QUESTIONS/CONCERNS:

Contact your chain of command.

4. Shower Shoes (flip flops)

ORGANIZATIONAL CHART

Effective immediately, all cadets in the George Washington Division are assigned a position in the organization. The below organization is effective until the end of November 2023 unless any individual's lack of performance or participation particular warrants a change. In November, we will make changes to the organization to rotate cadets and afford opportunities for leadership roles based upon many factors including rank, seniority, performance, maturity and expressed interest. The intent is to fulfill the U.S. Naval Sea Cadets developing leaders of character. There is no better way to learn something than to try it and experience both successes and failures. It is very important that cadets adhere to the organizational structure. There will often be cases where an individual's position in the organization places them in a supervisory role over individuals more senior in rank, age, etc. Each individual must play his or her assigned role and everyone's role is important. Therefore, each cadet is expected as a necessary first step to know his or her position(s) in the organization. Each cadet should know who their squad leader is and who he or she reports to in the organization.

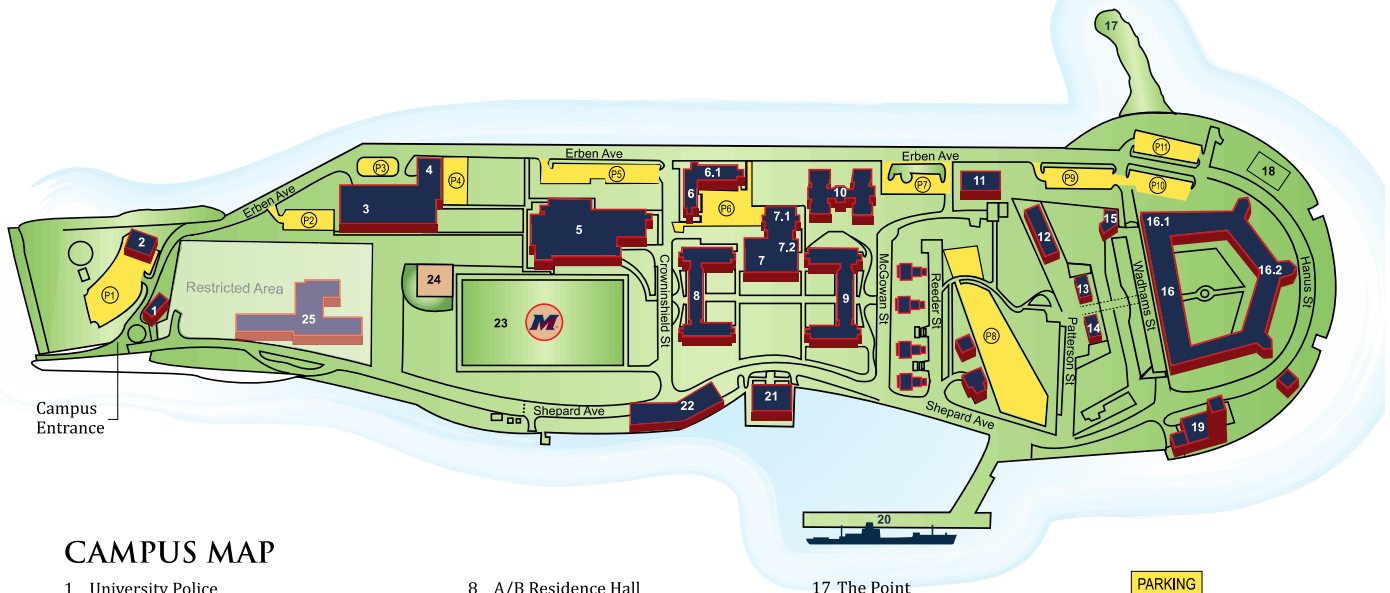

Chain of command operation - Go to your squad leader FIRST. If your Squad Leader is unavailable, go to your assistant squad leader. If your assistant squad leader is unavailable, go to the ALPO. If the ALPO is unavailable, go to the LPO.

NOTES

1. **DRILL WEEKEND** - Report to LPO with attendance. **We must hand in a roster of attendees the Thursday before drill.**
2. **UNIFORMS / ID / COVID VACCINATION CARDS** – Complete Uniforms with flashes and name tapes are required by all cadets. Hydration canteens and proper winter gear are part of your uniform. All cadets need their ID cards placed in the top right pocket of NWU blouse. Cadets are required to be cleaned-shaved. This means **NO FACIAL HAIR**. For more information read the website at georgewashingtondivision.org **Cadets that do not meet regulations will be sent home.**
3. **ATTENDANCE** – USNSCC Regulations state that you must attend 75% of all scheduled drills. That is four (4) of six (6) drills per quarter. If you do not meet this minimum standard, you will be administratively warned. If you continue to fail to meet minimum attendance standards, you will be discharged from the NSCC/NLCC.
4. **MEDICAL EXAM** – FORM NSCADM 001 (Page 5/6) Medical Exam Form is due annually. [[Download form](#)]
5. **COURSEWORK** – Assignments will be done on Polaris through Quarterdeck.
6. **PROMOTIONS/AWARDS** – Cadets ready to take the next promotion exam should contact XO or CO.
7. **INCREASE YOUR KNOWLEDGE** - Find out everything you want to know about the U. S. Naval Sea Cadet Corps on the NSCC Online Portal: <http://homeport.seacadets.org>.
8. **SITUATIONAL AWARENESS** – Watch the weather. Choose the PT Gear in accordance to weather report (sweats/shorts).
9. **CHOW** – All cadets are required to bring \$12 per day and hydration canteens.
